Dr. Steven Goodman is board certified in Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, and, Electrodiagnostic Medicine. He is currently Director of Outpatient Physical Medicine at St. Luke's Rehabilitation Institute in Spokane, Washington and Clinical Assistant Professor of Rehabilitation Medicine at the University of Washington. He first heard Dr. Gunn lecture on neuropathic pain and IMS at the University of Washington in 1993 and shortly afterwards attended Dr. Gunn's IMS Course at St. Paul's Hospital in Vancouver. Since then he has been practicing, lecturing on and teaching Gunn IMS at iStop, the University of Washington Pain Center and international meetings. At Dr. Gunn's request he recently co-authored along with Cory Choma a chapter on IMS in the physical therapy textbook, 'Trigger Point Dry Needling: An Evidenced and Clinical Based Approach.'
